Before we get you started on your amazing adventure, time to go over the ground rules!

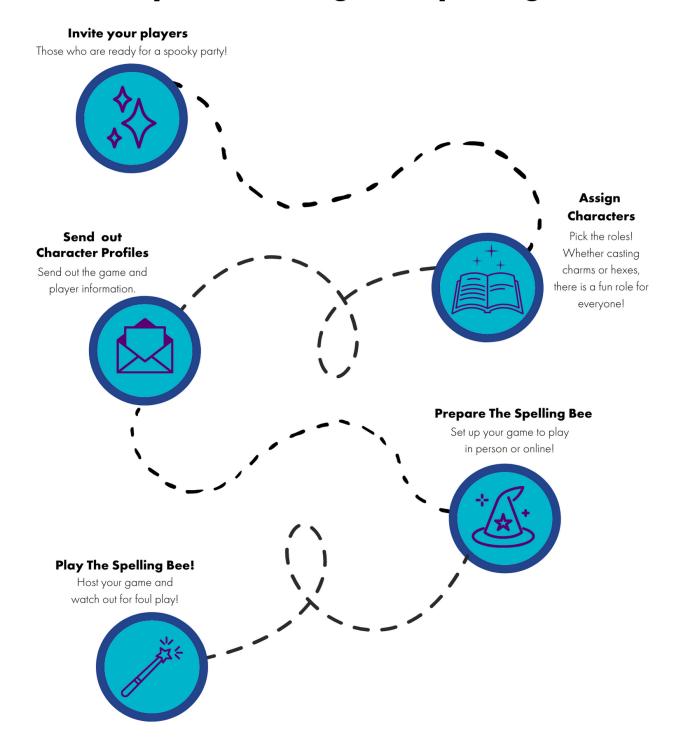
- 1. This game is intended for players 10 and older.

5 Steps to Hosting The Spelling Bee



First, let's answer a few of the most common questions hosts have:

What does the host do?

Just like any party, the host of a mystery game makes sure attendees have everything they need to have a good time. This guide will go into the specifics of assigning characters, preparing game materials, run-of-show, and a few optional extras that can enhance the game experience. If you are hosting a remote game, the host will also be in charge of setting up any technology that the game needs to run smoothly. Don't worry, we will go over all of this later on in the host guide. Because The Spelling Bee is meant for kids, the host should be an adult guardian or an older sibling or friend who can help organize the game.

As host, do I get to play a character?

In the Spelling Bee, yes, although it is a little different than our usual adult games. We have 1-2 roles for our hosts which should be played by adult guardians or older siblings or friends to help organize and keep the game moving. These roles will be outlined in more detail below.

Step 1: Inviting Your Players

The first step of any good adventure is inviting your party! **The Spelling Bee can support 6-8 players with an additional 2 roles for adult hosts**, so make sure your player count fits within that range. We find it's best to invite as close to the maximum number as possible, as sometimes players drop out.

One of the easiest ways to invite your players or notify their guardians is to create an RSVP form, either through Google Forms, SurveyMonkey, and other event apps. You can find an example form from us <u>here</u>.

One of your main roles as host is to assign your players their characters for the game. There are a few ways to do this:

- 1. Assign characters at random
- 2. Ask players to send you their top 3 character choices
